Nearly 1 in 3 Connecticut families struggle to afford diapers.

Through our Diaper Distribution Program for Infants and Toddlers, we raise awareness, distribute diapers through a strategic network of partners, and advocate to make diapers more accessible.

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) were not designed to cover the cost of diapers. We are advocating for Medicaid to cover diapers as basic health needs.

Access to diapers provides numerous benefits, including the improved overall health of babies and improved mental health of caregivers.

We are dedicated to giving people access to basic needs throughout their lifespan, and an adequate supply of diapers is something no one should have to go without.
