MENSTRUAL EQUITY SUMMIT

On August 3, 2023, The Diaper Bank of CT hosted its first Menstrual Equity Summit on the UConn Stamford campus. The summit brought together experts, advocates, and supporters to share our work and discussed the work still necessary toward reaching menstrual equity.

The day kicked off with a keynote speech by Jennifer Weiss-Wolf, followed by a period policy panel, moderated by Desiree D'lorio, WSHU Public Radio, and included Jenny Kohl, Advocacy & Outreach Coordinator, The Diaper Bank of Connecticut, State Representative Kate Farrar: Connecticut House Of Representatives Serving the 20th District, Dante Costa: Public Health Policy Associate, Connecticut Department of Public Health, Lacey Gero: Manager of State Policy, the National Diaper Bank Network & the Alliance for Period Supplies. The day concluded with a series of workshops: Inclusive Language & Discrepancies in Healthcare, presented by The New Haven Pride Center; Youth Advocacy & Why It Matters, presented by LiveGirl; and Endometriosis Research & How CT Is Paving the Way, presented by The Connecticut Endometriosis Working Group.

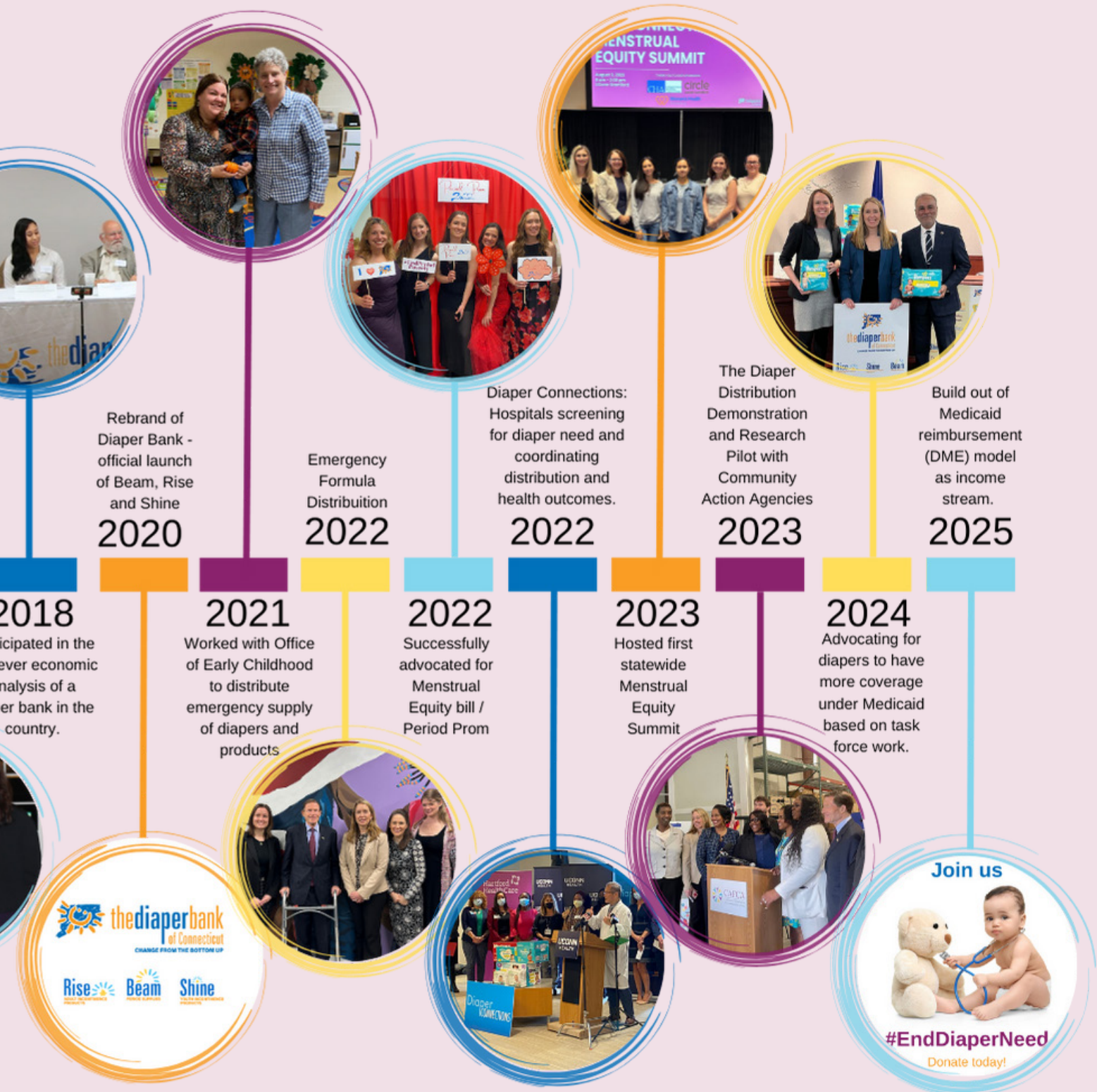

ADVOCACY UPDATE

The 2024 Legislative Session is over and while the outcome was **not** all that we hoped for, we are celebrating some key progress on ensuring that families with young children have their basic needs met.

Despite a budget surplus, it was a particularly challenging legislative session. We advocated for increased state funding to continue to support CT families at our current levels, and while that did not materialize, we did make some exciting progress on Medicaid coverage for diapers. The State of CT Department of Social Services is going to study the feasibility of expanding Medicaid coverage for diapers to children from birth to age three for whom diapers are medically necessary.

This is a critical first step and we are grateful for the collaboration of many across the state who offered their guidance, expertise and advocacy efforts contributing to this progress. A special thank you to the legislative champions who supported this effort and the Department of Social Services for actively engaging in conversations with legislators and advocates from across the state. This work continues and we will continue to push forward on our mission to ensure that all babies in our state are clean, dry, and healthy.

BUILDING A MORE EQUITABLE FUTURE

A growing number of families in Connecticut need our help, but our funding has not increased – and is never guaranteed. In fact, in December 2023, we used up the last of our \$1.4 million in ARPA funds. We advocated for the state to replace this support, but did not, and as a result, about 4,000 children were cut from our diaper program.

4,000 CHILDREN!

This is why we are working so hard to build a more equitable future - to help alleviate our reliance on fluctuating funding sources and set us up to become a more self-sustaining organization.

This year, thanks to a generous investment by the Viking Global Foundation, we are one step closer to building a sustainable future as a licensed Durable Medical Equipment (DME) Supplier. As a DME provider, the Diaper Bank will be eligible to receive Medicaid Reimbursement for youth and adult incontinence products; and the revenue generated from reimbursements will allow us to reinvest in our infant and toddler diaper program and reach more families.

Here's what we're focusing on:

- **Revamping Our Business Structure:** We're updating how we operate to be more efficient and adaptable.
- **Upgrading Facilities and Data Security:** We're improving our physical space and increasing our data security to keep information safe and support our growth.
- **Achieving Financial Stability:** By creating a Medicaid Reimbursement model for incontinence products, we'll lessen our reliance on inconsistent funding and become more self-sustaining.
- **Expanding Our Reach:** Reinvestment in our baby diaper program will help us reach more families and individuals statewide, tackling a wider range of needs.

With these changes, we're looking to build a more resilient and effective organization that can better serve our community.

Unrestricted income: Funds that can be used to support the organization's overall mission, without specific restrictions.

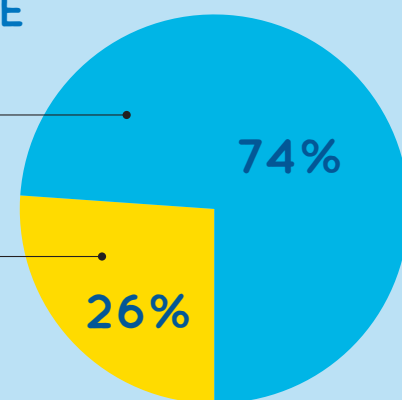
